Subject: Hudson River Source Water Assessment

Dear Mayor Bassett,

Thank you for taking the time to talk with me today about the proposal of the newly established Hudson River Drinking Water Intermunicipal Council to undertake an updated Source Water Assessment Plan (SWAP), and associated activities, for the seven communities that draw their drinking water from the Hudson River. This is an intriguing and complex proposition.

DEC, in consultation with DOH and a range of stakeholders, has recently complete a series of work group session concerning the appropriate attributes of a Source Water Assessment Plan (to identify risks) and an associated Protection Program (to present a program of actions to address and minimize drinking water risks). As you know, the prior SWAPs only looked at risks and generally were developed between 2000 and 2004 – making them significantly dated in many respects.

DEC and its partners are currently assessing the wealth of work group information, and reviewing possible options to fund and proceed to develop updated SWAPs – in complete cooperate with the involved municipality (who would need to take the leadership role). We will need a bit more time to more completely formulate a draft course of action.

Please accept my thanks to you and the other members of the Intermunicipal Council for taking on this important initiative. More to come.
